

Battery handling:

- To maintain good battery performance for the first-time usage or after long term storage, please fully charge the battery before use.
 Cycling (i.e. charging and discharging) of the cell / battery a 6-9-month period is highly recommended.
- Do not solder directly to batteries and unplug a battery by holding the connector itself and not by pulling at its cord.
- Do not attempt to take batteries apart or subject them to pressure or impact. Heat may be generated, or fire may result. The alkaline electrolyte is harmful to eyes and skin, and it may damage clothing upon contact.
- Keep away from children. If swallowed the batteries, contact a physician at once.
- Ensure correct polarity when connecting the correct charger for NiMH batteries. Do not reverse charge batteries.
- · When the battery is hot, please do not touch it and allow it to cool in a well-ventilated place out of direct sunlight before recharging.
- Avoid batteries being used in an airtight compartment. Ventilation should be provided inside the battery compartment; otherwise
 batteries may generate hydrogen gas, which could cause an explosion if exposed to an ignition source.
- If find any damaged sleeve, noise, excessive temperature or leakage from a battery, please do not use to avoid short circuit. Do not remove the outer sleeve from batteries.
- · Do not incinerate, mutilate or soak batteries into water or sea water, may burst or release toxic material.
- Battery-powered devices and batteries should be stored in cool dry and ventilated places at room temperature staying away from direct sunlight.
- · Do not short circuit batteries or place batteries with conductive materials, permanent damage to batteries may result.
- Remove all used batteries from the electrical device if the device is not going to be used for a long period of time and always
 replace used batteries with new batteries of same size and type.
- Do not mix new batteries in use with semi-used batteries or different types of batteries as it will affect the performance and conditions of your devices.
- The device should be switched off after the batteries are exhausted or find power down during use.
- Do not subject batteries to adverse condition such as extreme temperature, deep cycling and excessive over charge/over discharge.
